This guide outlines the most active advocacy organizations in Florida that promote values and agendas in direct conflict with biblical truth, parental authority, and constitutional freedoms. These groups are not operating on the margins — they are coordinated, well-funded, and embedded in schools, nonprofits, public meetings, and local campaigns. They are actively shaping education, policy, and public messaging across the state. This resource was created to identify who they are, where they operate, and what they represent. It exists to equip the faith-based community with the clarity needed to recognize their influence and respond with purpose.
